We have a new Principal this year so please make sure to welcome Leigh Schwartz to CES!





CLASSWORK -

- Google Classroom We will use Google Classroom as the Home Base for all classwork. This is the site that students should be logging into every day to start their work. Any other texts, links, videos or websites we use will be reachable from this location. We will teach or reacquaint students with how to use this powerful tool.
- Classcraft Mr. Gonzalez and Mr. Barbuto use this in addition to Google Classroom. They will teach students how to log-on, get connected, and use this amazing Learning Management System (LMS).

Laptops and Homework -

Every student will be issued their own laptop. Students will use the laptops at school. We are very excited to be getting brand new laptops for all our 5/6 students this year! Students will have to be extra careful with these laptops, therefore families have the option to leave them here at school every day so there is less chance of accidental damage. We will be sending home a form for families to sign before students can take laptops home. We will let you know on Classdojo when this form is sent home with your child so you can fill it out as soon as possible.



AMAZING EXPERIENCES



Ms. Berg, Mr. Barbuto, and Mr. Gonzalez do NOT assign much homework if any. For ELA Ms. Berg asks that students read a book of their choice at home every night. We all know that many families are busy in the evenings so if you would like homework for your child message us on Classdojo. If you are okay with having your child do no homework, that is completely fine.

This year students will have PE with Mr. Meacham, Music with Mr. Brennan, Art with Mr. Young, and Library with Mrs. Moriarty. Ms. Berg, Mr. Barbuto, and Mr. Gonzalez will have each class every day for approximately an hour and 30 minutes each. Schedules are included in this document on page 12.



Garden - The garden! This year we are adding our 5th & 6th grade garden work to our Ocean Guardian School's Environmental Stewardship Project! In June the garden team worked on an application to add the 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades to the Ocean Guardian School program so our entire elementary school is an official NOAA sponsored Ocean Guardian School! Mondays will be garden day for us in Science.

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Mathematics

Hello, and welcome to the beginning of the school year. This year in math, we will be continuing to discover many exciting new concepts, and likely encountering many gaps in student learning due to COVID that we'll have to fill in.

Over the course of the year, we'll cover

- Addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division of the three main types of numbers we have encountered in earlier years: whole numbers, fractions, and decimals.
- Using the number line, using a coordinate axis (x-y axis) to plot points & introducing the idea of a scatter plot
- Finding areas & volumes of different shapes
- How to analyze data by finding the mean/median/mode & talking about the idea of variation in the data

Also, while it is true that all of the students will be in mixed 5th & 6th grade classes, it turns out that the difference between the two math classes is mostly just the difficulty or length of the problems.



For example, both grades will cover volumes of "rectangular prisms" (aka, a box), but the 6th grade students will also need to find the surface area. This is something that the 5th graders can definitely attempt, but they will not be graded lower if they can't figure out. Over the year there will be several concepts which the 5th grade students attempt, but can are not expected to master (and these concepts will be clearly marked to not cause any additional stress).

ELA & Social Studies

English Language Arts and Social Studies with Ms. Berg

Welcome!! I am so excited to have 5th graders and 6th graders again this year! Our time in class will be spent reading, writing, and learning history and geography together. Our reading projects will also support the work we collectively do as an Ocean Guardian School.

For English Language Arts, the reading and writing we do in 5th and 6th grade builds on skills learned in 4th and 5th grade. We will be doing the same work, but feedback will be provided based on where students should be as the 5th or 6th grader that they are. This year we get to pilot (try out) a new Language Arts program for the first few months of school. All 5th and 6th grade students will be a part of this. After the pilot is over, we will continue reading and writing through a wide variety of tasks and experiences.

All 5th and 6th graders will be expected to read a book of their choice at home, every day. Twice a week they will be expected to respond to that reading by writing an entry in their Reading Journal, which will come home with them every day, except Mondays. On Mondays I will check them in for completion and every three weeks I will also respond to the entries by writing in the Reading Journal as well. This will be a regular opportunity to earn points in Classdojo. Students can get books from their regular trips to the library, from the classroom, or from home.





Reading 20 minutes per day, every day, has a wide variety of benefits, aside from the obvious academic benefits. Maybe the whole family can take on this challenge so everyone can benefit!

For Social Studies, there will be some separate grade-level work. For example, we will all do world mapping and general learning regarding the world. The 5th grade curriculum focuses on US History and the 6th grade curriculum focuses on Ancient Civilizations. Therefore, there will be times when the two grade levels will be receiving separate instruction and will be doing separate work.

Don't expect to see much work coming home, but feel free to look at Google Classroom work with your student anytime. Other work will be kept in notebooks here in the classroom, so that we can reflect on it and continue learning from it.



Ocean Guardian School

This year all students from grade 3 through 6 in Chimacum Elementary School are part of NOAA's Ocean Guardian School program! Our amazing garden team wrote a proposal to add the work they are doing as well as the watershed and creek restoration and salmon work all our classes have been doing. As part of the 5/6 grade Environmental Stewardship Project your child will get to participate in more amazing outdoor experiences this year. In addition to our garden work, 5th & 6th graders will study our watershed as we figure out ways to help maintain all the different habitats in our valley. It is this very Environmental Stewardship Project that Chimacum students have been doing since 2002 that made our school an Ocean Guardian School first! It is this project that earned Mr. Gonzalez the 2022 EPA Presidential Innovation Award for **Environmental Educators!**

In class, students will be learning about water pollution and human impacts on our world's waters. Restoration Stewards from the North Olympic Salmon Coalition (NOSC) will teach kids about Chimacum Creek and biological integrity. Mr. Gonzalez will take students to two spots along Chimacum Creek for fish trapping to count fish and for water quality testing. We might even get to go tree planting again!


